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PROFILE of University for Development Studies

The University for Development Studies (UDS) was established in May 1992 by PNDC Law 279 to blend the academic world with that of the community in order to provide constructive and meaningful interaction between the two for the total development of Northern Ghana, in particular, and the country as whole. It started academic work in September 1993 with the first batch of thirty-nine (39) students admitted into the Faculty of Agriculture. Although the University is still in need of physical infrastructure and teaching aids, it has steadily grown over the years, and now operates four (4) satellite campuses spread out in the three (3) Northern Regions of Ghana.

VISION

The University envisages a home of world class pro-poor scholarship. This is reflected in its motto: Knowledge for Service as well as its methodology of teaching, research and outreach programmes.

MISSION

The UDS seeks to achieve its vision by:

- Promoting equitable and socio-economic transformation of communities through practically oriented, communitybased, problem-solving, gender sensitive and interactive research, teaching, learning and outreach activities.
- Providing higher education to persons suitably qualified for and capable of benefiting from it.
- Positioning itself as a national asset in the facilitation of life long learning
- Developing its information and communication technology

infrastructure as the driving force for the education of more people, more rapidly and the improvement of efficiency and academic quality in order to advance community and national development.

CENTRE FOR CONTINUING EDUCATION AND INTER-DISCIPLINARY RESEARCH (CCEIR)

The Centre for Continuing Education and Inter-Disciplinary Research exits primarily to undertake inter-disciplinary research, facilitates and coordinates research activities in the Faculties and creates platforms for policy dialogue and engagement on research findings. Under the CCEIR is a Gender Studies Unit responsible for sensitizing the University community on gender issues as well as ensuring that gender issues are mainstreamed into the University's policies and curriculum in line with its strategic plan. The CCEIR is located at the Navrongo Campus. THIRD TRIMESTER FIELD PRACTICAL PROGRAMME(TTFPP) The University for Development Studies runs a community technical interface programme, a unique combination of the academic and community-based field practical work called the Third Trimester field Practical Programme (TTFPP). It covers a trimester in each academic year for three consecutive years and cuts across all Faculties, ensuring that students live and work closely in communities to identify, plan and formulate specific interventions to address specific challenges.

CENTRAL ADMINISTRATION

UDS ACCRA GUEST HOUSE

The UDS Accra Guest House started its operation in 2009. It is a 2– story block with a basement. It has thirteen (13) double selfcontained rooms and two(2) suits. Services provided include: Restaurant, Conference Hall for up to twenty-four (24) participants, an Office Accommodation, a Laundry, Common Room, a Bar and an Internet Facility.

- The Third Trimester Field Practical Programme ran by the University as integral part of the curriculum ensures that both students and staff work closely with disadvantaged, marginalized and hard to reach people in the communities
- It has an innovative admission policy geared towards solving gender unbalance and general inequity of access to tertiary education.
- The curriculum and pedagogical style are structured in a manner that provide students with the requisite academic and practical knowledge, tools and skills to effectively deal with development and poverty-related issues at the grassroots level.

Profile HARUNA YAKUBU

Prof. Haruna Yakubu, the new Vice Chancellor of the University for Development Studies(UDS), is a Semiconductor Physicist. Prior to his appointment as Vice-Chancellor, he was the immediate past Pro Vice-Chancellor of the University of Cape Coast (2006-2010).

Prof. Yakubu attended Jijiadeyiri Primary School in Wa, Aningazanga Experimental Primary School in Bolgatanga and Kalpohin Middle School in Tamale before proceeding to T. I. Ahmadiyya Secondary School in Kumasi for his secondary education in 1968. He was awarded a Ghana Government Scholarship to study at Kishinev State University, Kishinev in the former Soviet Union where he graduated with a Master of Science (M.Sc) degree in Physics and Mathematics in 1984. After returning to Ghana to lecture at the University of Cape Coast for four (4) years, he entered Moldova State University again in Kishinev, from where he obtained his Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D) degree in Semiconductor Physics in 1992. That same year, he returned to the University of Cape Coast as a lecturer in Physics.

At the University of Cape Coast (UCC), Prof. Yakubu did not only teach Physics, he was also actively involved in the administration of the University and occupied various positions including Head of the Department of Physics (2002-2003), Head of the Department of Optometry(2002-2003), Chairman of the ICT Committee (2001-2010) and Dean of Students (2002-2006). He was also elected the Professorial Representative of convocation on the UCC Governing Council for three (3) years before becoming the Pro-Vice-Chancellor. He has been lecturing at UCC for the last twenty six (26) years.

Between 1997 and 1999, Prof. Yakubu worked as a Research Fellow at the Italian National Agency for New Technology, Energy and Environment-ENEA (Department of Energy -

Portici) where he researched extensively into solar cell Profabrication techniques and for alternative sources of energy. Particularly, he worked on the optical characterization of for semiconductor materials and gro solar modules under Standard clim Test Conditions (STC) and Real Operating Conditions (ROC). He is well known for his works on "non-destructive optical characterization of solar cells" and d e p e n d e n t r e f l e c t a n c e on photovoltaic materials".

Prof. Yakubu has consulted for many international organizations on energy and other climate change subjects. He served as a focal person for a core group of scientists on the climate change technology needs and needs assessment of Ghana (2002).

He has published extensively including twenty nine (29) refereed publications, more than forty (40) conference and workshop papers. He has also published a book on energy security in Ghana

He is a member of many national and international associations. He was the President of the Ghana Science Association (1999-2002) and is currently a member of the Governing Council of the Foundation for Security and Development in Africa (FOSDA). He has many honours and awards to his credit and these include: Executive Member of the Ghana Solar Energy Society; Founding Member of the Energy Research Group, Ghana; Member of the International Solar Energy Society; Senior Associate of International Centre for Theoretical Physics (ICTP), Trieste, Italy and Member, Ghana Physical Society.

Prof. Yakubu speaks many international languages including English and Russian. He has attended many seminars/workshops on advancement, leadership development and institutional management in higher education.

Prof. Haruna Yakubu is married to Prof. Mansa Prah and they have two children, Kamal Yakubu and Rashid Yakubu.
